History taking

- Personal History
- Complaints
- Present history
- Past history
- Family history
- ➤ General examination
 - General appearance
 - Vital signs
 - Vital colors



- Lymph nodes
- Skin and extremities
- Head and neck
- Chest and heart
- Local Abdominal Examination
 - Inspection
 - Palpation
 - Percussion
 - Auscultation
- Investigations: LFT, CBC, Ultrasonography,
 - Endoscopy, Motility studies....etc
- Diagnosis
